

### TAKE ME OUT TO THE BALL GAME



# Pastor's Thoughts

Summer is the season that many people that I know wait all year for. The season is noted to include the months of June, July, and August. Three months, essentially (we can still have good weather into October – we just can't count on it), out of twelve. Oh, sure, there are the various holidays to occupy our time (Halloween, Thanksgiving, Christmas, and New Year's Day) but it is summer that we wait for.

Then, when summer arrives, there is so much to do. Getting out the lawn furniture, tending to gardens and flower beds, summer vacations, baseball games, various fairs, carnivals, Fourth of July celebrations with fireworks, picnics, visits to parks, hikes, cookouts with friends and family. There is a potential danger in our approach. We wait all year for summer, then rush through it so quickly that we may not enjoy it. We could become so busy enjoying the summer that we...don't *actually* enjoy the summer.

There may be other areas of life that are similar. For example, we can't wait to graduate high school, so we do what we need to do to get out without enjoying what it has to offer, then look back and say, "I wish I had tried..." fill in the blank. We begin college, or a career, and become so busy with creating a home, raising a family, paying bills, working we don't enjoy that phase of life. We look so forward to retirement...and soon, we are retired and wonder where the time went.

I wonder, do we rush through our time with God in a similar way? I mean, we spend time at church worshipping God, we spend time in prayer giving thanks and making requests and petitions, maybe we spend time reading or studying our Bibles. But do we take the time to truly experience worship, prayer and study? Or do we rush through those activities because, well, there are so many other things that we need to do?

# **Baptism**

I am often asked about the significance of baptism. I am also asked about the timing and method of baptism. Some faith traditions baptize babies, some sprinkle those being baptized with water.

Let me see if I can explain, for those who might be asking now. For the Christian, a personal testimony is a verbal witness of his faith. Similarly, baptism is a visible witness to that faith. The act of baptism expresses union with Christ, and with our spiritual family.

But the primary reason for baptism is that Jesus commanded it of His disciples.

<sup>19</sup> Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, <u>baptizing</u> them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, <sup>20</sup> teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. (Matthew 28:19-20)

As Baptists we believe that the proper time to baptize an individual is after they have made a verbal confession of faith. That confession occurs once they have an understanding of who Jesus is and how His death, burial, and resurrection is sufficient for people to be reconciled with God, and they have made the conscious decision to become an active follower of the Risen Savior.

We practice baptism by immersion simply because "baptize" (baptidzo, in the original Greek) means immersion. Just as Jesus was immersed in his baptism by John the Baptist, we immerse in our baptismal.

While baptism isn't required for salvation, it is instructed. And typically a profession of faith is often made in a private setting, baptism is a very public event where family and friends are invited to attend and witness. In that way it is an opportunity to celebrate and welcome a new believer into the faith.
