

Helping Hands for Haiti

Here is much more than sewing sessions happening with the Haiti Mission Foundation! A group of 20 ladies met at First Baptist on September 12 to assemble dresses, 166 of them!, skirts and shorts for the residents of Haiti. Now Sue Allen and others will be embarking on a mission trip to Haiti to deliver the clothes and other much needed items.

They will fly into Cap Haitian in northern Haiti on October 5 after a stop in The HMF headquarters in Virginia. Fifteen people from the U.S will be joined on this mission trip by Haitian volunteers. While there, they will assist at the clinic, distribute vitamins, baby formula, bandages, ointment, and "happy meals" – coupons for kids to go into the market for a meal. The dresses will be distributed at two schools supported by the Foundation.

The Mission committee sent a check for \$500.00 to the Haiti Mission Foundation and gave Sue money to enable her to purchase items while in Haiti (including happy meals.)

We will continue to support the Haiti initiative with another birthing bag sewing and assembling event on November 9, 9AM-2PM, and tentatively on March 8, 2025, at our church. All invited. Watch for details.

In the meantime, you ask, what can I do? Purchase and donate chewable vitamins(no gummies) for both children and adults. We will collect as many as possible and forward them to our friends in Haiti. There will be a container at the back of the church. Thank you in advance.





St. Pauly Update


Last year 23,341 pounds of clothing were donated to our shed. This was enough to clothe an estimated 4,300 people all over the world.

Pastor's Thoughs

Autumn is my favorite season of the year, which makes October my favorite month. The crisp air, the changing leaves remind us of the beauty in every season of life. October in particular, fall in general, is really a transition season, from summer to what we know is coming after autumn...there is beauty there as well.

Just as nature transitions, our lives go through many different phases, different seasons. But remember, God's love remains constant and unchanging whatever season or time of transition we find ourselves in. Looking at Psalm 100:4, we are called to "Enter his gates with thanksgiving and his courts with praise; give thanks to him and praise his name."

October, with its harvest and gathering in, is a time to reflect on the abundant blessings God has provided. Even in seasons of challenge or uncertainty, God is faithfully working behind the scenes, preparing a harvest in our lives. The response to this from my friends has been incredible, and very humbling. I thank you all for your concern, and thank you in advance for your contributions.
